It is my prayer all of you had great Resurrection Sunday celebration, and now we journey through the days of Eastertide. I came across this devotional written by Rev. Mary Johnson of the United Methodist Church based on John 20:19-31.

"Even though the disciples did not believe that the Resurrection was real, Jesus still came to them. Jesus was not angered by their unbelief. Instead, Jesus breathed a word of peace upon them. Jesus did not ignore Thomas' questions about the Resurrection; instead, Jesus addressed them directly. Jesus seemed to understand that this event was forcing his followers to believe an unbelievable truth. They were slowly realizing the truth that his death upon the cross was not the end. The truth was so much more than they could have thought or imagined.

The goal of discipleship is to learn from Jesus. The best students ask the most questions. Jesus welcomed questions and answered questions with even more questions. Jesus did not cut off the discussion but encouraged it. This is how we learn. We find that the older we become, the less we know because we develop the capacity to ask more questions. As we grow in understanding, new questions fill our minds, questions we never imagined asking when we were younger.

Questions are not an indication of a lack of faith. Questions lead us deeper into more substantial faith, filled with intricacies and nuances. Questions lead to a fuller understanding, filling in some of the blanks we never even knew existed.


